

A five-level process

Innovative practice	<i>Good practice implemented in the partner municipalities</i>
Transposition	<i>Action allowing one municipality to adopt innovative practices implemented in another by collaborating <u>directly</u>¹ with it (core of the project)</i>
Innovation	<i>Action by which a partner municipality appropriates innovative ways of functioning</i>
Mechanism	<i>System which organizes efficaciously and efficiently a set² of transpositions within a learning group of municipalities</i>
Network	<i>Multiplication of the pilot mechanism</i>

Target Actors

Roles

Source municipalities	Enhanced value of the experience and sponsorship in the transposition
- Municipalities - Accompanying experts	- Municipal cooperation (<i>reciprocity</i>) - Support and advice
Addressed municipalities	Adoption of innovative ways of functioning
- Organisms having authority to support municipalities - Voluntary partners	Coordination and animation of the actions
- Actors similar to all those listed above (pilot mechanism) - Supra-local authorities	Dissemination through action

¹ Municipalities play the first role in the partnership, the other stakeholders act according to them, as a support to the transpositions.

² It must be understood that several municipalities contribute to a same transposition and that several complementary transpositions are jointly implemented.
